Day 1

TODAY'S THEME: EXPLORE IT

Read Genesis 25:1-18; Hebrews 11:8-13

- 2. How did Abraham treat Isaac differently from all his other sons?
- 3. What ends up happening to Abraham in this passage?
- 4. What does this passage teach us about God?
- 5. How would you characterize Abraham's life? How would you describe him to someone?

Day 2 WHY ALL THE FAMILY TREES?

Genesis 25:2-6, 12-18

"She bore him Zimran, Jokshan, Medan, Midian ..." Lots of times we get to these genealogies and find all these ridiculous names we can't even pronounce, and what do we normally do? Skim to the end of the list and keep moving. I mean, what's so important about all these names anyway? It's not like they tell us anything. WRONG!

I get it, it's hard to read some of those names, but they actually are really important. For example, all the names in this passage of Genesis are significant in wrapping up the story of Abraham! They tell us that Abraham had lots of kids who had lots of kids. You know what that means? God is continuing to fulfill His promise to Abraham from back in Genesis 17:4, where He tells Abraham that his name is now changed from Abram to Abraham because he is going to be the father of many nations! So while the names might all seem tedious and unnecessary to us, they are written down so that we might know that God was faithful to Abraham and He kept His promises.

The rest of the genealogies in the Bible help teach us kind of the same thing because ultimately, they all end up leading down to one person—JESUS! And it's through Jesus that God again continues to keep His blessings to Abraham by blessing all the nations of the earth by offering salvation to everyone! So I guess next time you read a genealogy in the Bible, stop and thank God that He is so faithful.

Day 3 WHY IS SALVATION ONLY GIVEN THROUGH FAITH?

Read Romans 3:21–4:5

Most religions require you to be good enough in order to receive the grace and mercy of the god of that faith. It's like they put everything good you do and everything bad you do on a scale and you better hope you did enough good to outweigh the bad. But that's not the case with Christianity. The Christian faith teaches that we are saved only by our faith in God. He has done all the work in saving us. In Romans 3–4 Paul is talking about Abraham, and he teaches his readers that Abraham was justified by faith. He was considered righteous because he believed God first and then his works affirmed his faith. Otherwise, if Abraham was justified by our works, then we earn it; it becomes something that is due to us. And that would give us a reason to brag about ourselves. We could compare ourselves to others and brag about how "good" we are in comparison. But instead, God has leveled the playing field per se by giving us salvation by faith alone. That way we have nothing to brag about but Him! Now every person who is saved can't say it was something they did, but something God did. We are all saved in the same way Abraham and Paul were—FAITH!

This also gives us great assurance of our salvation. We never have to worry if we are being "good enough" to get into heaven someday. We can know for certain that we will spend eternity with God because our salvation isn't based on ourselves but on God, and God is never-changing. So we can have greater confidence in our salvation because it is through faith and not through our actions.

8. How should salvation through faith alone in Christ alone change the way we think about our own salvation? How about how we think about others?

9. What makes accepting salvation through faith alone so challenging sometimes? Why should we be thrilled that salvation is offered through faith alone?

PRAYER GUIDE > Here are some things you could pray for today:

Lord, thank You for giving me salvation based on your grace, mercy, and love and not my own actions. Now I have great confidence that I'll spend eternity with you! Amen.

Day 4 WHY SHOULD I PUT MY FAITH IN JESUS?

Read Hebrews 12:2

Let me give you three reasons from Hebrews 12:2 why you should place your trust in Jesus:

Jesus authors your faith. Believe it or not, we do not come up with faith on our own. Our faith is given to us by God and for God's glory. That means we can't just conjure up enough faith to trust in God. That means that the faith we have comes from Him in the first place. So wouldn't it make sense to take the faith that He has given to us and place it back in Him?

Jesus suffered for your forgiveness. Jesus didn't just say, "Hey man, trust me." He suffered greatly on your behalf so that you could trust Him. God won't just ignore your sins because He is a just God. Your sins had to be dealt with. So there are some options. Option 1 is that He let you pay the penalty for your own sins which will take you an eternity, literally. It will involve great suffering and complete separation from God. Or Option 2 is God could pay the penalty for you that you can receive through faith. That means that Jesus came and suffered and bore the full wrath of God on your behalf, if only you'll receive His suffering through faith. He has proven His love for you by how greatly He suffered to make forgiveness available to you.

Jesus triumphed for your future. But Jesus didn't only suffer, he triumphed as well. He was beaten, mocked, and crucified for you. But after three days in the grave, Jesus rose from the dead, defeating death itself. He did this to give you victory as well. When we receive salvation through faith in Jesus Christ, we receive forgiveness of sins through His sacrifice and we receive victory through His resurrection. He now sits at the right hand of the Father in heaven, waiting for us to come join Him someday in Paradise!

10. How do you determine if something is trustworthy? How can you determine if Jesus is trustworthy?

11. If someone gave up their life to save you (maybe jumped in front of a car, ran into a burning building, gave up their heart, or anything like that), how would it change the way you lived moving forward?

PRAYER GUIDE > Here is something you could pray for today:

Thank You for Jesus' sacrifice on my behalf, that He would suffer in my place. Amen.

Day 5 HOW DOES FAITH GIVE HOPE?

Read Hebrews 11:8-13

Abraham, like everyone else mentioned in Hebrews 11, "died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth." They were waiting for the promised Messiah to come that God had promised long ago. Their faith gave them hope in something greater that was yet to come. Hebrews 11 is filled with snippets of people's lives who lived by faith because they were hoping in this promise. Hebrews 11:1 says that "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." What that means is that faith is being certain about these things. For Abraham, his faith meant that he was certain that God would fulfill His promise to make him into many nations and that He would bless all the nations of the earth through him even though he would never see those things happen. Faith changes the way we live now because we are certain of something better to come later.

12. What do we have faith in today as God's people?

13. What can make it difficult to have faith sometimes? How can our faith grow when it is weak?
