## **Day 2**

### **Today's Theme: Our Future Salvation**

#### **Read Hebrews 2:10–13**

There is always something to look forward to. Maybe it's an upcoming school play, or maybe it's a tournament for your sports team, or maybe it's seeing your friends for the first time in a while. Whenever we anticipate something that we care about, it affects how we live. If you're anticipating a play, you might try to memorize your lines or audition for a certain part. If it's a tournament, you'll go to practices and open gyms.

Our salvation is the same way. Even though Jesus has saved us from our sins, we still have sin in our lives, and as a result, we experience a sometimes less than desirable world. However, as Christians, we know that there is coming a day when we will be in heaven with Jesus forever. No more crying, no more pain, and no more sin! And if we are anticipating that day, it will change the way we live!

### **Day 3**

#### **Today's Theme: Our Present Salvation**

#### **Read Hebrews 2:2-4**

As we learned yesterday, there is coming a day where your relationship with God is going to be radically different (and radically better) than it is in our sinful world. But that doesn't mean that you can't have a relationship with Jesus today. According to an acronym of the Gospel, your relationship with Jesus doesn't start when you get to Heaven.

God created us to be with Him.

Our sins separate us from God.

Sins cannot be removed by good deeds.

Paying the price for sin, Jesus died and rose again.

Everyone who repents and believes in Jesus alone has eternal life.

Life with Jesus starts now and lasts forever.

Your life with Jesus starts now! You don't need to get your sin cleaned up first. You don't need to read through the entire Bible first. You don't need to do anything! If you believe the Gospel, Jesus freely offers you a relationship with Him that starts now.
