**TODAY'S THEME: FAMILIAR COMPANY** 

Read Acts 28:17-20

When Paul arrived in Rome, as was his custom, he first sought out the Jewish people there. Although he was still under Roman custody, he had been given a great deal of freedom now, and he could invite people over and see people. So he invited these Jewish leaders over to his house to talk with them. When they came, he explained to them why he was in Rome and some of the things that had happened leading up to this. But perhaps the most important thing he said was in verse 20, "For this reason, therefore, I have asked to see you and speak with you, since it is because of the hope of Israel that I am wearing this chain."

TODAY'S THEME: JESUS IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

Read Acts 28:23

Did you know that everything that's written in the Old Testament is written to point towards Christ? Paul was able to reason with the Jews about who Jesus was from the Old Testament Scriptures by showing them that what they've believed all along was leading to Jesus as the Messiah! In Luke 24, after Jesus rose from the dead, he was walking on the road to Emmaus with a couple of His followers. Along the way it says that "beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself."1

Jesus was the one who had been promised all along. He was the promised Messiah mentioned first in Genesis 3:15. He is the focal point of Scripture. All the Old Testament leads to Christ and all the New Testament comes from Christ!

After Paul had spent a whole day explaining to the Jews about the kingdom of God and showing them from the Old Testament that Jesus was the promised Messiah, some still did not believe. This isn't news to us. We have seen this happen time and time again throughout the book of Acts. Some Jews would believe, some wouldn't. But this time Paul quotes a passage from Isaiah about them having eyes that do not see and ears that do not hear. That doesn't just mean they didn't see at all. It means that they were shown the truth. It was explained to them. But God had not given them the eyes to see it and believe. So even though everything was laid out clearly before them, some still just did not believe the gospel about Jesus.

Read Acts 28:30-31

What an ending to the book of Acts. With all the build up to Paul getting to Rome you probably would have expected that we would have been told a lot more about his time there! We aren't told anything about his trial before Caesar. We aren't told that thousands and thousands came to faith in Jesus Christ there. We are simply told that Paul spent two years there and proclaimed the kingdom of God and taught about Jesus with all boldness and no hindrance. That's it! And if your Bible looks anything like mine, there's a bunch of empty, white page left. And I think that's pretty neat.

The story in many ways, isn't over. Sure, the acts of the Apostles are done now. But the continuing story of Acts 1:8— "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth"—is not over As

dis	ciples of Jesus Christ, we are still carrying on this story and this mission that all people might hear the good news Jesus Christ.
